Contract News

After a marathon meeting of 14 hours on January 24 between the college and the AFA, the new contract is nearly finished. There is agreement between the negotiating teams of the college and the AFA on principle and substance; right now the exact language of the contract is being decided, as it is a legal document. Then the final document is submitted for typing and proofreading. After March 4, the AFA will begin holding informational town halls to share what has been negotiated and to answer questions. Adjunct faculty who are not members but wish to attend sessions may do so but may not vote on the contract unless they join the union. Go to the AFA website (oaktonadjuncts.com) and sign up.

Members will vote on the contract sometime afterward; it is hoped that the contract can then go before the Oakton Board of Trustees at their April 26 meeting for ratification. Just a reminder: only members of the AFA can vote on whether to accept the contract or not.

Pritzker Vetoed House Bill 2778, but...

The governor vetoed the Illinois House bill that would have required public school districts and colleges to give paid leave for workers who take days off related to COVID-19. This includes quarantining and caring for children. However, talks between the governor and NEA resulted in a compromise replacement bill focusing on staff who are vaccinated. Under the new proposal, only fully vaccinated school employees will qualify for paid leave and restoration of sick days. Hourly wage workers who have had to miss work due to a school closure because of Covid will also get paid. Dan Montgomery of the Illinois Federation of Teachers said, "We applaud Gov. Pritzker for his steady support of science and good public health and thank him for working with us to provide teachers, school staff and higher education professionals with critical resources that will help them keep kids safe and schools open."
